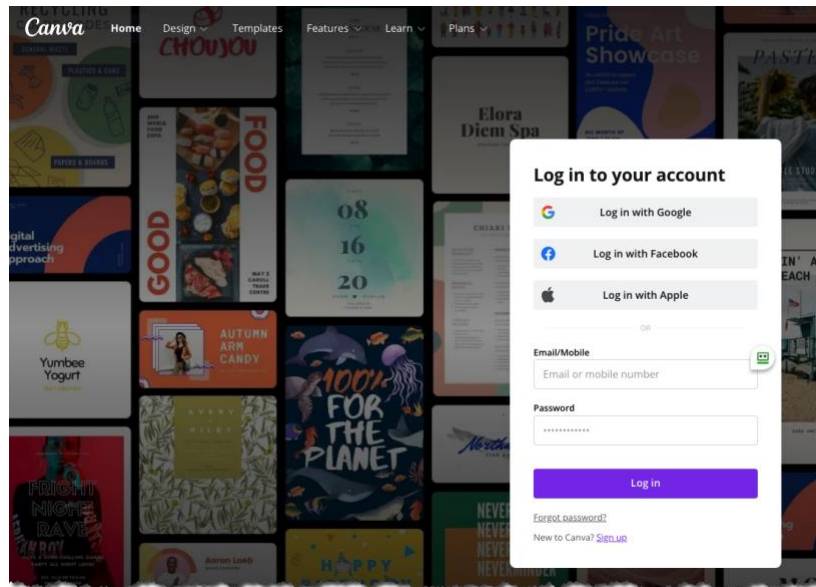
In any case, I think we have a great solution that will make it as easy on you as possible to upload our designs into [your own Canva account](#) so you can have full editing capabilities and own the images.

Step 1

Log into your [Canva.com](#) account.



Step 2

Click the links given to you in your downloads – one at a time:

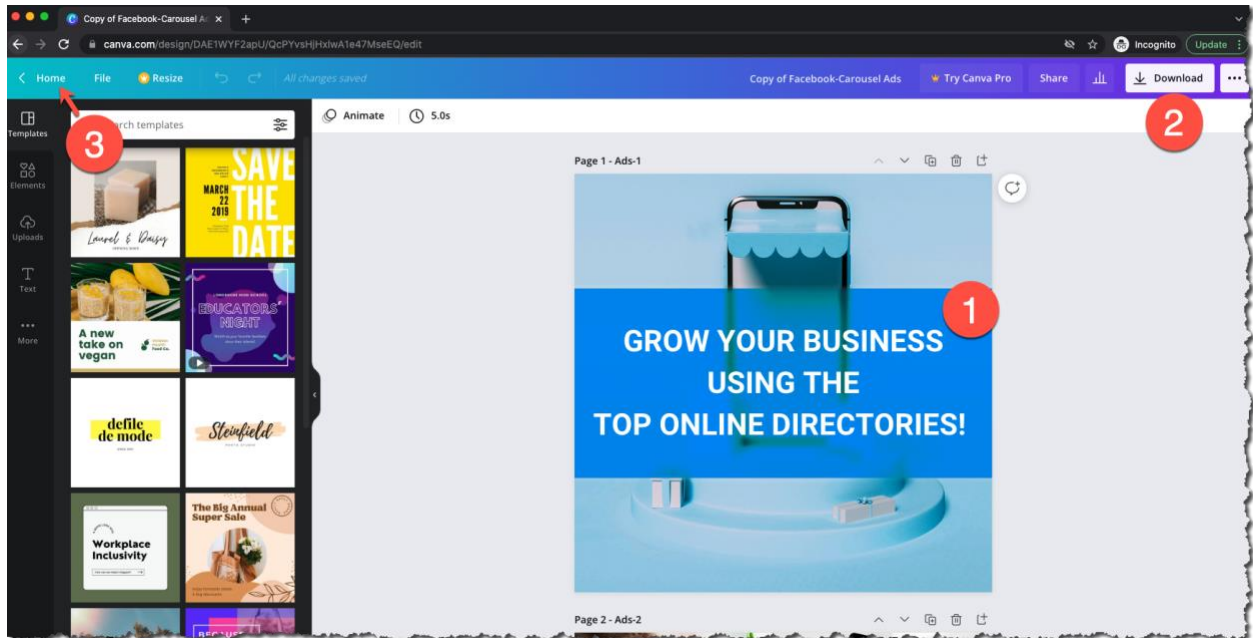

Enjoy your new design!

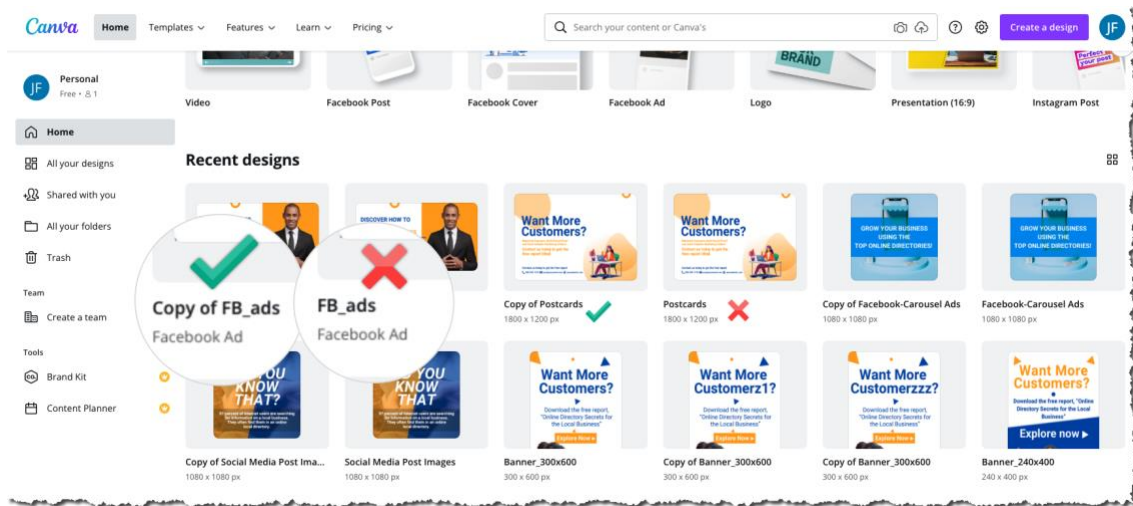
1. Edit your new graphic (if needed)

IMPORTANT

As we said earlier sometimes Canva is a PIA. You'll noticed when you go back to your [Canva home page](#) you will see two versions of the designs you created from the template links we provided.

You can ONLY edit the one that says, "Copy of [Image Name]." You can view the other version but you can NOT edit it.



Please use the "Copy of..." version and put it in a folder and rename it for easy reference and access later on.
